

Grant Elementary School Classroom Building Addition

The Grant Elementary School Classroom Building Addition was part of the Proposition MM School Facilities Improvement Program for the San Diego Unified School District. Roesling Nakamura Terada Architects, Inc. (RNT) was chosen to assist in providing design and construction administration services. The work included a new two-story classroom building constructed on an existing elementary school site. The building consists of seven classrooms, instructional support service rooms and restrooms. The project was constructed to reduce the number of on-site relocatable classrooms. A school committee consisting of teachers, parents and school administrative staff was formed to provide input on the programming and design of the school.
